They may be considered highly respected protective guardians of people and places, or in some traditions as dangerous, predatory beings.



PINOT NOIR 2014

APPELLATION: Marlborough, New Zealand

VINEYARDS: From selected estate grown vineyards

VINIFICATION: Machine harvested fruit is cold soaked and fermented in square stainless steel fermenters, the berries were then gently pressed with 100% malolactic fermentation and aged in a combination of new and old fine grain French oak for 10 months.

TASTING NOTE: Fruit was harvested at optimum ripeness which enabled this wine to be produce great complexity and weight. A lovely vibrant coloured wine with aromas of dark fruits. The palate has bright cranberry, raspberry and strawberry flavors with a smoky oak and earthy finish.

ALCOHOL CONTENT: 13.5 % VOL

RESIDUAL SUGAR: 2.0 g/l

TOTAL ACIDITY: 5.2 g/l

CULINARY SUGGESTIONS: Enjoy with a variety of cuisine – NZ lamb and venison are a particularly good match.

SERVING TEMPERATURE: Between 16 -18 degrees celcius
